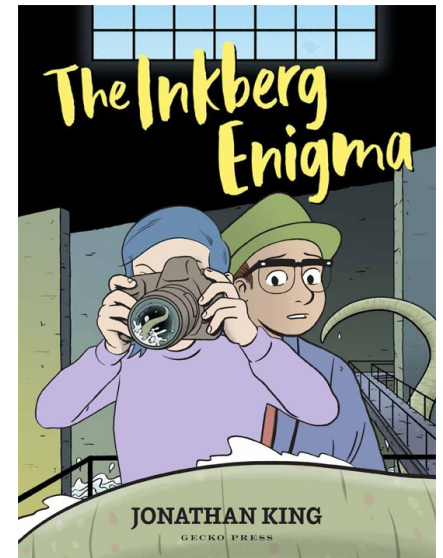
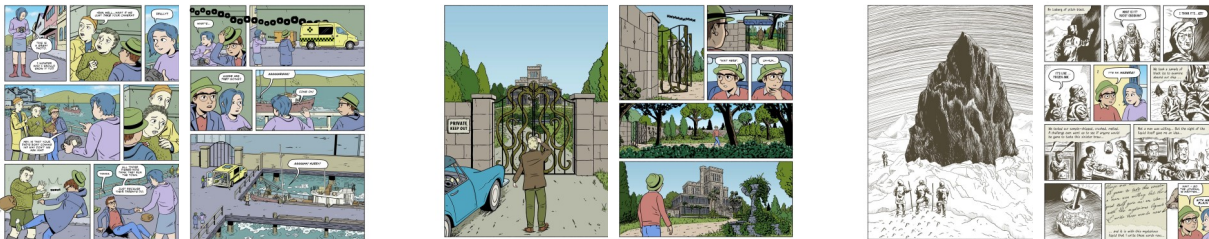




The Inkberg Enigma

Miro and Zia live in a sleepy fishing town. Miro's into rare books; Zia is a budding photographer. Their hobbies lead them to notice something's not right in this town nestled in the shadow of a creepy castle on the hill, where the ocean stirs up unusual and dangerous creatures. Miro and Zia start to investigate, and soon their questions put them on the wrong side of the town's fishermen, who are soon revealed as not entirely what they seem.

The Inkberg Enigma is an exciting adventure with a strong filmic narrative. Jonathan King's ligne claire drawing style nods to the Belgian and French classics alongside a modern storytelling sensibility drawn from his background in film.

Jonathan King is a prominent filmmaker whose debut feature *Black Sheep* remains one of New Zealand's biggest-selling feature films. Its international awards include the Audience Award at the Gérardmer Fantastic Film Festival, the Silver Raven at the Brussels Fantastic Film Festival and the Sir Julius Vogel Award for Best Dramatic Presentation. King co-wrote, produced and directed a film adaptation of New Zealand children's classic *Under the Mountain* by Maurice Gee, starring Sam Neill, which has been released worldwide. King's comics have featured online and in anthologies. This is his first children's book.
